where they are. This can create an insidious disconnect from our true calling as Christian believers. We are called to be in relationship with God, our Father through the Son by His Spirit in community. Our American society today has, for the most part, lost its interactive and relational community identity. We've traded our inter-dependence (community) for largely impersonal feel good "communities." Sort of like doing Bible studies where knowledge is valued more than understanding, and discussions are focused on circumstances, not His promises. God is looking for us to experience community through unity with Him (commune + unity = community :-).

Recently I went to an Alzheimer's conference and heard that keeping those impacted by this disorder active in their

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events in our own lives. The excuse most often given comes from Scripture, as any good, self-respecting, Christian will do.

The verse offered comes from Philippians 3:13 (NIV), "Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead." I believe we miss out on much of its meaning as we isolate these words from the rest of the chapter and from the Bible as a whole. Let's start by looking at the context of these words.

Earlier in the chapter, Paul writes about things he could boast about in his own past and how he now sees these things as "refuse" or



"garbage," that he might "gain Christ." He saw the need to take an inventory of his past, see it for what it was (repent of the thinking that made those things valuable to him), in order to grow in his relationship with the Lord. We have a problem doing this when we fail to recognize the nature of sin and the nature of the Father.

The best definition of sin I have ever heard is, "sin is that which destroys God's creation, namely us." With that definition, God becomes a loving Father in whose love we can trust (1 John 4:16) rather than a petty dictator giving us a bunch of rules to follow to keep us from desirable things. (See Genesis 3:5-6.) Sin is much

community keeps the disease from progressing. Essentially it helps keep them aware of their identity. We shouldn't need to be diagnosed with an identity robbing disease to recognize



the value of supporting our identity through Christ-centered community.

less of a temptation under this definition and bondage to sin loses its grip on us.

So, when Paul admonished us to forget what is behind, what was he talking about? The story of Lot's wife gives us a clue. While escaping the destruction of a wicked and sinful city and after being warned not to look back, Lot's wife still longed for something she was leaving behind. Another example is when the children of Israel were traveling in the desert under God's provision began to complain saying, "We remember the fish we ate in Egypt at no cost—also the cucumbers,



melons, leeks, onions and garlic." (Somehow, I don't remember hearing about all of this good stuff while they were crying out to God in their bondage.) Rather than "straining toward what is ahead" (gaining Christ), they were looking at the good things in their past that never really existed.

Fear robs us of the opportunity to look back on those hurtful events that keep us bound to their poison. These hurtful events have taught us not to trust, to protect ourselves from the very

And yet, there are those who will run away from this principle of community believing that they are heading off into their Godly vision only to find a mirage.

The Word tells us to not forsake the gathering of the saints (that would be us; commune + unity) and to pursue the Kingdom of God first, THEN all these things (visions and dreams) will be added to us. We're to do this with the mind of Christ (which yields to Godly wisdom and counsel) with the joy of the Lord as our strength while not leaning on our own understanding but acknowledging (trusting) Him in all our ways, so that He can make our paths straight.

relationships our loving Father wants to bless us with, to see life itself as a perversion of God's good intentions for us. But perfect love casts out fear (1 John 4:18) and gives us the courage to face



these hurtful events and reframe them from the heart of our Lord who promises us "that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28) Then we can take inventory of and reframe these events just as Paul had to do with his former way of thinking. Through this process, we replace the hurt with hope, the violation with victory, and pain with promise. The scales will fall from our eyes so we can see our world as He sees it, no longer filtered by fears of our past.

Let's forget (repent of) all of those pleasant sounding, and SELF-protecting, lies we've grown accustomed to so that we can press forward for what is ahead.
