As our newsletter name implies, we have a **New Name!** Literally and eternally! Legal restraints forced us to stop using First Stone ministry as our name, but we haven't changed our focus!!! Despite the disappointment and confusion of losing our former identity we are en-

couraged by the new doors opening and the ensuing opportunities to serve.

We sense our present state of transformation is similar to the process Abram must have gone through when God said to start using his new name of Abraham. We truly believe that the path God has us on will effect change not just here in Texas but for our nation.

When I originally received the vision that led to the use of our former name of First Stone, it was my identification with the adulteress in John 8 which colored my world. This unsolicited name change brings a different view of our ministry and the men God is bringing to it. No longer shall we be called outcasts and lepers. The Lord will give us beauty for ashes, joy for our mourning and the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness! All this to the glory of His name!

When you read Revelation 2:17 you see that He gives a new name written on a white stone that only we will know. The things of God are not hidden from us but for us. Ministry in Motion!



Pastors Dick Witherow and Jon Cordeiro co-presented at the 5th Annual National Prisoner Re-entry Conference in Dallas on October 13 – 15. The topic of the presentation, Dealing with Special Populations (Sex Offenders), covered issues related to offender profiles, recidivism rates and current laws. The factual information and statistics provided

were surprising given all the mis-information the public receives through sensational news media coverage. Pastor Cordeiro pointed out that recidivism rates are far lower than typically reported in the media. Based on an eleven year study in Michigan tracking 4,762 paroled offenders, 93.89% did not reoffend. Only 2.46% returned to prison for the same offense and the other 3.65% returned on a technicality. In a recent briefing, The State of Texas Council of Sex Offender Treatment quoted a statement from Psychiatry News reporting 80% of sex offenders that undergo treatment DO NOT reoffend. In addition, Pastor Witherow provided vital information on aftercare for sex offenders and Pastor Cordeiro provided guidelines for sex offender church attendance. A SPECIAL THANKS to Rich Wootton for the countless hours spent researching, collecting and organizing all the information used for the presentation.

On December 1 representatives from Restorative Justice Ministries as well as Pastors Cordeiro and Leonardson met with Senator Tommy Williams' Legislative Director in Austin, Texas. The Director was presented with information about restorative justice,

mentoring and the United Methodist church's Newgate Initiative. Pastor Jon Cordeiro provided logistics and statistics on sex offenders and transitional housing.

It was off to Houston on December 13th. Pastor Cordeiro met with the Community Partnership Council (CPC) consisting of participants from

parole, RJM, family counseling, other transitional housing ministries, and SAA. Dr. Judy Johnson (head of the state's sex offender treatment program) spoke with participants. Among the issues cited was the lack of facilities to release paroled sex offenders back into the community and the lack of effective tools to assess risk.

Dear brothers,

I am writing for this news letter because I feel led in my heart by the Holy Spirit to share the hope given me to other sex offenders, or to any other person held in bondage of sin. First of all let me introduce myself. My name is Frank Herrera. I was incarcerated for thirteen years as a sex offender and completed an eighteen month Sex Offender Treatment Program (SOTP) at the Hightower Unit. I am living at the Christian transformation home called New Name Home, directed by Pastor Jon Cordeiro, also a former sex offender. Our vision here is for social reform through the church for the nations.

I am writing to you because I can relate to you all and hope to help you make the transition through prison into the free world. Before I can help you must make the decision that you want to help yourself first. Starting with applying and making an effort in any positive program you can while incarcerated. This is not only something I am telling you to do, but did myself. When I first arrived at Hightower Unit I was negative. Fortunately I received the help of others like Mr. Richard my case manager, and my group therapist Mr. Manuel. The members of my group helped me too as well as those on my wing, especially with all the assignments. I encourage you to take treatment seriously, you'll get out of it what you put into it – be real.

Here at NNM we only accept those who are willing to be accountable and deal with their stuff while walking right with the Lord. We currently have 6 men in the home committed to the ministry and the men in it. We have rules, chores and boundaries that are in place for the benefit of all.

Since being here I have enjoyed all of the fellowship during the week that we must attend as well as our Fellowship on Sunday nights which is non-denominational. All of which is based on our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the peace of our Lord. We are not perfect, but we all are striving together to be conformed more into the image of our Lord. Whatever condition you might be in as you read this know that there are people out here who really care, I'm one of them. Please feel free to write me. Praying for you all.


