At the same time I am completing my ministry time there are several new men at the houses here at P40 wondering if they will be able to complete the program and graduate. What is the difference between those that graduate and those that do not? During my year in the New Name program eight men have left before completing it. They were of all different personalities, and I am not qualified to identify any specific trait they had or lacked that caused their leaving or removal from the program, but here are some qualities I think necessary to succeed. There is nothing expert here, just my opinion.

Honesty – Transformation takes energy, a substantial amount of it. We all have a self-image that has developed throughout our life. We become used to our way of thinking; it's the platform from which we view the world and how we interact with others. When we encounter a person, a situation, or any circumstance that challenges that thinking and viewpoint we tend to resist. Unhealthy resistance can promote criminal thinking leading to a destructive self-image and behaviors affecting our happiness and that of others. One can commit a lot of crimes without ever breaking the law. We have to be willing to look at attitudes, assumptions, and thinking and how they have caused difficulties for ourselves and others.

Your Day in Court: Verdict Assured

Distractions, distractions! Even sitting in prison can be a distraction. At the very least it can be a delay of your destiny and/or a destruction of your identity. Without knowing who you really are you'll NEVER reach your destiny. And even once we discover who we were created to be and who's image we are created in, we can still come up short simply by not being aware of how things really work spiritually. If you think you have it all figured out, think again. I am continually humbled that there is so much more to God and the Kingdom that I need to embrace and apply to my life. I think it best to maintain childlike faith with such an awesome Father in Heaven. The Kingdom of Heaven is a real place with real principles in operation that can work for us or against us. Remember, God's scales are true. In other words, He can't break His own laws. We have likely all heard about sowing and reaping; but do you understand that our actions don't override our motives? Doing things with the wrong motive (manipulation of God) is how Satan received God's permission for bringing tribulation upon Job. Though

Job was a righteous man sacrifices for his kids in hopes of persuading (manipulating) God not to punish them for unrighteous partying. So, apparently, even the best of us are subject to giving the enemy legal grounds to bring curses in our lives.

Self-examination has to be critical and real not just a cursory and biased review of circumstances where (as usual?) we come out blameless. Stop thinking like a victim and critically examine your life and actions. We tell ourselves lies and come to believe them because we need to. A selfexamination means taking a hard look at how we see ourselves. This is not a time for excuses, or justification. Look deep at cause and effect; be tough on yourself. Forgiving yourself comes later.

Courage - Question, "How can a man be brave when he is afraid?" Answer, "That is the only time he can be." I am certain many of you recognize that exchange between Ned Stark and his son from Game of Thrones. Courage is not only about facing difficulties and challenges of parole and life; it's about making a change in yourself which begins with a change in thinking, and it takes nerve to do this. It's an uncomfortable and frequently painful thing to confront yourself and acknowledge the harm you have done, but courage has nothing to do with the absence of fear; it's about acting in spite of it and using it to motivate.

Motivation - One can succeed at parole without New Name or after dropping out of the program, but New Name is about more than parole. It's about living a new and better life as a different person where you are happier, and that happiness finds its way into others. You have to want it; no rule, no guideline can force a change.

with a pitchfork. Let's not forget where he came from. Satan was one of God's highest-ranking beings.
