My idea of what it was going to be like when I got here to NNM was exceeded after only being here for a short period of time. Patience has always been one of my biggest issues. I always want to hurry up and get to where I want to be, before I even taught myself how to get there. As I've come to learn, maturity comes through hard work and obedience to what GOD says. There are no shortcuts to spiritual maturity.

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Paul said "Those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, and those who live according to the spirit, set their minds on the things of the spirit". Well, I do have a strong desire to live according to the spirit. I feel the Holy Spirit working in me, not only when I feel convicted after a misdeed or bad thought, but also guiding me in the right direction. Even in this short period of time, I have seen significant improvement.

There is no doubt in my mind that GOD placed me here at NNM for a reason. He has surrounded me with different people that I need and for me to make the transformation in my life to serve Him better. He knew I would need a highly educated person to help teach me. And someone that I would sometimes butt heads with, (of course all in a learning experience).

I literally walked to the altar for my second marriage thinking of divorce. I had been divorced once already; it was no big deal. It's no surprise that the second marriage ended as the first did after a much shorter duration. To this day I cannot say specifically why those marriages ended, only that they became inconvenient. For years the pattern continued with romantic (if that word even applied) relationships and friendships. I was all in, provided it was convenient; any significant interference with my wants and the relationship had to get in line or go away.

My justification for this behavior was that I was an "individualist," but it is easy to dress up selfishness in high blown, childish, and difficult to define terms. Selfishness and indifference to others can become addictive and ominously easy to justify, the damage accumulating with an increasing number of victims. There is a price for this behavior. The damage also accumulates within the practitioner eventually creating a prison as confining as anything made of iron and stone.

Unidentified problems never get corrected. This is why treatment programs have an immediate goal of ruthless honesty for the process of self-examination. The program at New Name Ministries is designed to root out selfishness, and I was required to live differently than I had before

And my very own sister [guess you know who that is] who just lights me up with joy every time I see her. Hello, my name is Joe Dale Holleman with New Name Ministries. I started out as a child pretty good; at least until I became aware of being raised in a beer joint on old Route 66 in Amarillo. My mom loved to drink so much she bought two bars and we always had lots of drinking friends. I did not grow up in a Christian home. By the time I was fifteen, the state asked me to sign-up for Job Corps in San Marcos, Texas. After two years of that I came home and got mom to sign me up in the Marines, and that day I turned 18 and was shipped out for Da Nang, Vietnam. Little did I know that didn't make me into the man I wanted to be. Instead it turned me, or I let it make me into a very serious drug addict.

For the rest of the next forty some years I was in and out of prison since 1972. I have four prison numbers. The one I have now will never come off because it is for life. At 41 years old I was given a life sentence for being a habitual criminal. For so many of these years I never knew what love was, never loved anyone or anything but drugs, fast women, and faster cars. At the age of 56 the Lord Jesus opened my heart. I cried for joy that the hardness was gone, and yes, Jesus has changed my heart. I am now 68 years old, and our Lord paroled me to New Name Ministries in Ft Worth, Texas this year.

I have truly been transformed in prison at the Telford Unit, 23 of 28 years in straight. I am learning how to be a man of God in the free world. It is good place for me here at New Name Ministries. Yes it's been one big step for a man who did 28 years.

Everyone in this ministry loves and has taken me in like I am one of their own. I enjoy the accountability standard of this program. I have made wonderful friends and brothers here. I now am starting a regular job and it's going to be fun. I'm learning to go the extra mile, and the second mile is my smile mile-Its all good and for the Lord Jesus. Blessed be the name of our Lord, and great peace to the brotherhood.
